CONFORMATION JUDGE

Rick Thompson, Chaminade Shelties - National Specialty All Classes & Breed



I am moved by the opportunity to judge the Canadian Shetland Sheepdog Association National Specialty. I have had the esteemed honor to judged some of the most significant Shetland Sheepdogs in modern times in both the Canada and the United States. I have had the honor to pass judgement on some dogs that have made a significant impact to modern times. My 50 year investment in our breed has afforded me the opportunity to breed a bitch that won ASSA Best Brood Bitch.

One of my hallmark show wins was in 1990. I was awarded ASSA BOB with the first bi-black to win Breed at the American National Specialty. To date I have judged at the American Shetland Sheepdog National Specialty three times and the Canadian National Specialty once. Being asked to judge at a National Specialty by a vote from your peers is the ultimate goal of every judge. Your consideration is rewarding.

It is the owner of the dog entered that is responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Please review email confirmations so corrections may be made **prior to closing date** to avoid disappointment.

8.6.1 The authorities of any show may decline to accept entries for just cause

4.1.5 No person may approach a judge whether directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

The person handling the dog in the ring shall be recognized as the Agent for the owner of the dog. Delivery in the ring of any prizes won shall constitute full delivery of the prize to the rightful owner. No prizes will be mailed.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTHS – This class shall be for any dog 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler **MUST** be the owner/co- owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs divided by colour :Black, Blue, Sable shown in alpha order.

VETERANS CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered. This class will be divided into 7 years and under 10 years, 10-12 years and 12+ years. Judging to directly follow sex appropriate Winners competition. All 1st placements in these classes will compete for Best in Specialty.

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class **MUST** be received by the Show Secretary **ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED**. TCN Fees **WILL NOT** be refunded.

If the number of Specials entered warrants it, Male and Female Specials **MAY** be divided into groups (within their own sex) to accommodate handlers with multiple specials. IF a group split occurs, all specials still must be checked into the ring in numerical order to confirm they are present. All dogs will then exit, and Group 1 of Males will be called into the ring for judging. At the judge's discretion, a cut may be made, and Group 1 will exit before Group 2 is called into the ring, and the process will continue as needed. Group sizes and process for movement of dogs between groups will be determined after entries close.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class **MAY NOT COMPETE** in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades **ONLY**

BABY PUPPY - This class is for dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show.

BRACE - This class is for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily the same sex). A brace must be handled by one person on one lead.

STUD DOG - This class shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership in this class need not be identical. The stud dog may be spayed or neutered and must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class.

BROOD BITCH - This class shall be the same requirements as Stud Dog.

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASSES

Eligibility for the Altered classes shall be limited to dogs over six months of age, which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points MAY NOT be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered class judging. This class will be judged upon the completion of Best of Breed divided by sex.

Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winner from each sex will be declared Winners and the second place winner from each sex will be awarded Reserve. The Altered Winners Male and Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best Altered in Breed.

JUNIOR HANDLING

Obedience - Thursday, October 8th, 2026, following the Obedience Classes

Conformation - Saturday, October 10th, 2026, following the Conformation Classes

Judge: Obedience - Penny Jackson

Conformation - Rick Thompson

Entries will be accepted at the show secretary's desk up to one hour prior with no exceptions.
\$2.00 entry fee.

The following classes will be provided:

Pee Wee (non-competitive) - 4 to 6 years

Junior Novice - 7 to 10 years

Junior Open - 7 to 10 years

Intermediate Novice - 11 to 14 years

Intermediate Open - 11 to 14 years

Senior Novice - 15 to 18 years

Senior Open - 15 to 18 years

Competition is open to all Junior Handlers between the ages of 4 and up to 18 years of age (of the competition year). Pee Wees do not compete for best overall. Dogs handled by the juniors must be entered in a Regular Conformation class or in Exhibition Only at this group specialty. Dogs do not need to be owned by the junior.

Pee Wees - participation ribbon

Best Overall Handler - rosette and prize

Reserve Overall Handler - rosette and prize

1st place in each class - rosette and prize

2nd to 4th in each class - rosette

Please note that effective January 1, 2016, in accordance with Section 3.4.1 of the Junior Handling Rules & Regulations, Junior Handlers will be required to apply to CKC Head Office for a **Junior Handling Number**. Section 3.4.1 "Junior Handler with the exception of Pee Wees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number within 30 days of competing in their first Junior Handling event. This Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handling number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked."

SWEEPSTAKES - Saturday, October 9th, 2026, Preceding Regular Conformation Classes

Juvenile Sweepstakes

Judge: Norma Jeanne Pohl

Juvenile Sweepstakes is open to all Shetland Sheepdog puppies four months and under eighteen months of age regardless of place of birth. All dogs must be entered in one of the regular official classes on the same day. Dogs will be judged in one of the following classes (divided by sex):

Baby Puppy - 4 months and under 6 months
Junior Puppy - 6 months and under 9 months
Senior Puppy - 9 months and under 12 months
Juvenile Puppy - 12 months and under 18 months

For final judging the first place puppy from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 15% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes
Runner Up in Sweepstakes - rosette & 10% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes
First in Class - 20% of class fees and a rosette
Second in Class - 15% of class fees and a rosette
Third in Class - 10% of class fees and a rosette
Fourth in Class - 5% of class fees and a rosette
25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

Veteran Sweepstakes

Judge: Norma Jeanne Pohl ~ following the judging of the Juvenile Sweepstakes

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all Shetland Sheepdogs 7 years of age and over and entered in a regular class or for exhibition only on the same day. Spayed and neutered dogs may compete provided they are also entered in exhibition only.

Dogs to be judged in one of the following four classes (divided by sex):

7 years and under 10 years
10 years and under 12 years
12 years and over

For final judging the first place winner from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes and Best Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 15% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes
Runner Up in Sweepstakes - rosette & 10% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes
First in Class - 20% of class fees and a rosette
Second in Class - 15% of class fees and a rosette
Third in Class - 10% of class fees and a rosette
Fourth in Class - 5% of class fees and a rosette
25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Ring Size: Approx. 40' x 50'

No dog may be entered in both Novice "A" and Novice "B", Open "A" and Open "B" at the same trial. In determining class eligibility, if a dog shall have won a particular title before being entered or moved up, the handler shall have been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores for the required title. (However, a dog may continue to be exhibited for 60 days in a class after winning a particular title.)

Dogs fulfilling the requirements for a title may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the show secretary at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.

PRE-NOVICE - The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of PCD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of CD may enter the Pre-Novice class.

NOVICE A - The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.

NOVICE B - The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises.

NOVICE C - The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title CD or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in Novice C indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs in the Novice C class are not eligible for High In Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE - The Novice Intermediate class is an elective class and earning this title is not a requirement to enter the Open classes. The Novice Intermediate class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a CD or any higher obedience trial titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle the dog in all 6 exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

OPEN A - The Open A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate family. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH title may not handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in these classes, any scores awarded will be cancelled.

OPEN B - The Open B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD. Dogs which have earned the title of CDX or any higher titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility Class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times.

UTILITY A - The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

UTILITY B - The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX or UD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

BRACE CLASS - The Brace Class is open to any 2 dogs that have earned the title of C.D. or higher. It is not necessary that the same person owns both dogs, nor that they be the same breed, except when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial. The owner or any other person may handle a brace in this class. A person may enter more than one brace in this class. The same handler must handle each brace in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more braces entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra brace when they are judged together in the Group Exercises. The Brace Class is performed and judged in the same manner as the Novice Class. The 2 dogs shall be hitched together with a brace chain or coupling and are judged on the performance of the 2 dogs as though they were one.

VETERAN CLASS - The Veterans Class shall be for any dog that has earned the title of C.D. or higher and is 7 years old or older on the day of the trial. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice Classes. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises

TEAM CLASS - The Team class is open to any four (4) dogs that have earned the title of CD or higher. It is not necessary that the same person own all dogs in the team or that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed- specialty obedience trial. Five (5) dogs may be entered, one (1) to be considered as an alternate. However, the same four (4) dogs must compete in all exercises. The exercises will be performed simultaneously and judged as specified for the Novice class with the following exceptions: (a) The Figure 8 will be performed as part of the Heel Free exercise. (b) For the Drop on Recall exercise the dogs will first be called and dropped individually, then perform the second portion of the recall and the finish simultaneously. This exercise will be judged as specified for the Open class. Judgment will be based on the performance of the dogs and handlers, plus team precision and coordination. The scoring shall total four (4) times the value of each individual exercise. Each dog receiving a non-qualifying score for an exercise will be automatically scored zero (that is, a full 1/4 off the total score for that exercise for the four dogs). To qualify, a team must have a final score of 680 or more points out of the maximum 800 points and must have earned more than 50% of the available points in each exercise.

RALLY CLASSES

No dog may be entered in both Advanced "A" and Advanced "B" at the same trial or Excellent "A" and Excellent "B" at the same trial.

RALLY NOVICE A - Dogs competing in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice (R.N.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY NOVICE B - Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY INTERMEDIATE - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.I. or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

RALLY ADVANCED A - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY ADVANCED B - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY EXCELLENT A - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this case must be the owner, the co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class, A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class .However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY EXCELLENT B - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class, A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash except the Honor Exercise. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY MASTER - This class is for dogs that have earned the RE title. Any person may handle the dog in this class. Dogs must earn 3 qualifying scores of 85 points or more under at least 2 different judges.

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
